We will have the best Livestock Guardian Dogs (LGDs) available in Lane County by mid-June (10 weeks old). We have four boys and five girls, all as cute as punch. We will keep one boy (which is why we bred the mother). We are a working farm with goats, chickens, ducks, alpacas and cats, and will be barn-training the pups to be outdoor workers. With Zozo we have not lost any livestock to predators, unlike our neighbors. We have poor fencing, live on a river in the forests with cougar, coyotes and raptors, and Zozo has been a GREAT LIVESTOCK GUARDIAN DOG. The dad comes from a nearby winery, and they hit it off.

Both parents are purebred GP stock, the mother's side is from Roseburg and Texas; the father from Salem, so we are assured of no overlap for strong pups. Both parents have beautiful back "mascara" markings around their eyes, hence the glamorous photo at the top. We expect the kids to have that too. As they age, our experience is that the other black markings tend to disappear as the adult coat comes in snow white.

We believe Great Pyrenees is the LGD of choice for Lane County. They love the outdoors, sleep outside, even on the snow, and take their guardian jobs seriously. Also, both parents are great with small children. The perfect dog to protect your farm.

Come see our pups. We are on a family farm just outside Eugene (Pleasant Hill), by appointment only. We are selective on where we place them, as this breed needs lots of land. All pups will be current in vaccinations.
